BIBLE

Learning about God, his love, faithfulness, and miracles is fun and easy with our Bible Curriculum. Children learn how to apply God's word to their life while gaining a better understanding of the scriptures they read. They memorize scripture verses and learn about stories in the Bible that will stick with them for as long as they can remember.

LANGUAGE ARTS

The 4th Grade Language Arts curriculum gives your child exercises to practice capitalization, punctuation, run-ons and fragments, recognizing all 8 parts of speech, and more. Writing in paragraph form will be enhanced as well as learning to write letters.

MATH

We will practice multiplying and dividing 2-3 digit numbers, estimating, and writing decimals as fractions. Your child will solidify their understanding of square measures, solving perimeter and area, simple geometry, as well as proper and improper fractions.

SCIENCE & SOCIAL STUDIES

In these subject's students will learn how to make an insect zoo, how to identify plants, and how to interpret cloud formations. Your child will appreciate the miracle of germination, the causes of weather, the design of the heavens, the ecology of the ocean depths, and other aspects of God's creative genius. Charts of states and presidents, plus foundational documents such as the Preamble to the Constitution, The First Amendment, The Gettysburg Address, and more are included in the back of the textbook for your child to memorize and appreciate.
